She is a teacher and a teacher trainer and has been teaching English to all ages and levels since 2002. She is interested in using stories and arts & crafts in the classroom and is a translator of children/teen books.

Filipa Daniela Duarte has a degree in LLM - Portuguese/English and a MA in Educational Science. Filipa been teaching VYLs, YLs, teens adults more decade. She particularly interested in storytelling, teacher training, methodology and materials development.
