'Create, Inspire, Be Flexible!'

Welcome to the APPI Alentejo Seminar, welcome to our first professional development meeting of teachers of English in 2019-2020. This Seminar has been made possible thanks to the motivated, generous support of the Executive Board of the host school - Escola Secundária Padre António Macedo - a second-timer on the list of APPI Seminar sites.

This Seminar has been accredited by the *Conselho Científico-Pedagógico da Formação Contínua* – a total of 12 accredited hours to be granted to delegates.

The Seminar key topic is 'Create, Inspire, Be Flexible!' It may invite delegates, speakers and organisers to question themselves about its meaning and how to make it happen both in teaching and learning, i.e. in the classroom. The checklist is extensive and may well include the following sample questions: 'How do you bring creativity into the classroom? Do your students develop and display their creative language potential on a regular basis? Are you as a teacher available to welcome and encourage it?'; 'What makes a teacher inspiring? How do you inspire your students by teaching them? How do you motivate students to actively participate in class?'; 'Why is it of critical importance for teachers to be flexible? How do you cope with change in your teaching? How do you teach students to be flexible?'

A few sample answers may come to one's mind: 'Be present with students' ideas..., encourage autonomy..., re-word assignments to foster creative thinking; design a plan to help students in need..., explore inspirational teaching resources other than the usual ones..., do a *cool* teaching, not boring...; respond to different student abilities, needs and interests..., in a *sink or swim* classroom situation, being flexible will allow you to *swim*..., always tell students to integrate the feedback they get into their learning...'

In short, 'Are you in touch with your own creativity, inspiration and flexibility as a teacher?!'

To this effect, our speakers, who have answered APPI's call for the *Seminário*, have been kindly invited to develop this topic as they see suitable, particularly by sharing their perspectives on it. APPI is most thankful to them for their dedication.

A warm Thank-You is also due to our local member Ana Nunes who has liaised with her school Board and APPI.

This Seminar, like any other bigger or smaller professional development event planned by APPI, has been organised with hard work and great gusto, and aimed at making a difference in delegates' classroom work and their students' performance.

The APPI Executive Committee wishes delegates and speakers a high-quality, fruitful Seminar.
